- Ice Breaker Representatives participated in an ice breaker activity to become acquainted with each other. Parents shared personal information about themselves.

 - Program Information Report (PIR) Ms. Yolanda Macias, Program Officer, explained the PIR Summary provided to Representatives. Past Delegate Agency, MCA, is listed on the report because they had a contract with SETA Head Start last year.

 - Head Start and Program Governance Overview Ms. Marie Desha, Social Services/Parent Involvement Coordinator, explained the Head Start Shared Governance Organization chart provided. There are twelve regions; SETA Head Start is in Region IX. There are five Delegate Agencies: Del Paso, Elk Grove, Sac City, San Juan, and WCIC/Playmate. The PAC serves in the capacity of advising and overseeing the Head Start program. The PAC models after the PC and approves mostly everything that the PC approves.

Vote results for Chair – Mr. Donald Clark, 8. Ms. Kathy Ruiz, 8. Tie-breaker vote results – Mr. Clark, 9. Ms. Ruiz, 7. **Mr. Donald Clark was elected Chair** with 9 votes.

Vote results for Vice Chair – There was only one nominee. <u>Ms. Kathy Ruiz was elected Vice Chair</u> with 15 votes. Ms. Kim Creed did not vote.

Vote results for Secretary – There was only one nominee. Ms. Virginia Snoe was elected Secretary with 16 votes.

Vote results for Treasurer – There was only one nominee. Ms. Salina Davey was elected Treasurer with 16 votes.

Vote results for Parliamentarian – There was only one nominee. <u>Ms. Templa Allen was elected Parliamentarian</u> with 16 votes.

All elected officers assumed their seats.

B. Selection of Representatives and Alternates to Attend the California Head Start Association (CHSA) Annual Parent Conference, January 29-30, 2007, Newport Beach. Background information read by Mr. Clark. Ms. Nelson shared Conference information and Ms. Desha shared information on the *Schedule H Other* handout. There will be a travel meeting, Friday, January 26th, 1:30 p.m., Oak Room, for those selected to attend the Conference. Meeting information will be mailed to attendees. Mr. Clark read the Parent Advisory Committee Representative Conference Attendance Guidelines attached in the agenda.

Motion by Ms. Snoe to approve the selection of two Representatives and two Alternates by show of hands vote. Seconded by Ms. Allen. Discussion: Ms. Buffie Engstrom shared that staff can assist with typing conference reports. The airline fare, hotel room and meal expenses are paid up front by SETA Head Start. Child care reimbursement is paid upon receipt after the Conference. Ms. Desha made note that this conference is local and not out of state. Ayes, 14. Nays, 0. Abstentions, 2, (Mr. Clark and Ms. Allen). Each nominee explained why they would like to attend the Conference.

Motion by Mr. Shier to elect six Alternates by show of hands vote. Seconded by Ms. Ruiz. Ms. Snoe asked if child care during early meeting hours has been looked into, whether there is a budget for this to allow more Representatives the opportunity to attend the meetings. Ms. Engstrom shared that child care is not going to be provided during the day due to the child being in the Head Start program during the day. The intent was to train Head Start staff to provide relationship enhancing training to fathers and their significant others/wives. SETA Head Start will be recruiting to provide a training in January, 2007, called "Creating a Family." SETA is proposing a 10-week training (including child care) at SETA, beginning February 8th through April 19th, to ten 18- to 25-year-old couples. ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVE AND ALTERNATE TO THE SETA HEAD START COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CPAC)

BACKGROUND:

The Parent Advisory Committee is requesting to select one (1) Representative and one (1) Alternate to serve on the Community Partnership Advisory Committee (CPAC). This advisory committee is an advisory group to the Head Start social services program area of Head Start.
