Question 1): Does the funding cover 12 months or 14 months?

Answer: The amount referenced in the RFP was an estimate based on an annual allocation. The actual final award may vary.

Question 2): Is the Board Resolution supposed to be part of the proposal or submitted only if an agency is awarded funding?

Answer: The agency needs to submit a resolution as part of the proposal showing that an individual has the authority from their Board to submit a proposal on the agency's behalf.

Question 3): Is follow-up due on the monthly activity report? Is job placement follow-up also reported monthly until the funding has ended?

Answer: Yes. CalJOBS is used as the case management system, and there are activity codes that will be submitted on a monthly basis to document the services that youth are receiving, including follow-up which may occur after the funding has ended.

Question 4): If an enrolled youth does not retain employment, does the Youth Provider need to obtain new permanent employment for the youth until the program year has ended?

Answer: Yes.

Question 5): Is there a number requirement for program participants?

Answer: Each agency should propose how many youth it can serve, based on the funding and the agency's cost per participant.

Question 6): What services come out of the funding that will be given? Does it include Work Experience wages?

Answer: Yes. It consists of all services, including worker's compensation, payroll taxes, and supportive services.

Question 7): Will the Galt area's boundaries be extended?

Answer: The minimum area of Galt that an agency must offer services to is outlined in the RFP. The goal is to serve Galt youth within the boundaries highlighted at a minimum.

Question 8): Can a job placement be outside of the Galt area's boundaries?

Answer: Yes.

Question 9): Is the extension for agencies renewable upon successful completion?

Answer: Yes. There are up to two more one-year extensions once the contract is awarded. Depending on funding allocations and overall performance, an agency's contract may be extended.
