As the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA), a joint powers agency of the City and County of Sacramento, prepares to develop its new 3-year plan for the provision of Refugee Support Services (RSS) and RSS Set-aside funded services to refugees, Program Years (PYs) 2026-29, input is needed from stakeholders within Sacramento's refugee resettlement network, and the refugee community on ways services can best support the needs of refugees resettling in Sacramento County. RSS services are intended to result in the employment and economic self-sufficiency of refugees who have been in the country for five years or less.

The new plan will respond to the current and foreseen challenges faced by the refugee community, will address changes in demographics, will provide a framework for regional collaboration, will encourage continuous improvement of services to refugees and other qualifying statuses, and will respond to federal and state policy direction in refugee resettlement.

Information gathered at the hearing will be compiled and incorporated into the draft 3-Year plan, as applicable, and will be made available for review and public comment beginning Monday, March 2, 2026 (subject to change) on SETA's website at www.SETA.net.
