I. ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS:

A. Approval of Minutes of the October 8, 2024 Regular Meeting

B. Approval of the 2025 Action Plan and Annual Program

Mr. Ellis reviewed the draft 2025 Action Plan provided in the handout and noted that a recent change is that there will no longer be sponsorship solicitation for seminars going forward.

II. INFORMATION ITEMS:

A. KPI Monitoring

Ms. Knifton reviewed the KPI Monitoring for the 2024-2025 program year, covering the first two quarters, which ends in June 2025. She was excited to announce that the goals for the Customized Recruitment/Job Fairs and Customized Recruitment Event Attendees categories were met. Additionally, the Job Posting Hires category has exceeded expectations, reaching 129%. Ms. Knifton noted that the size of employers still heavily favors medium and large businesses, indicating a need for more representation from small businesses. The Employer Newsletter Open Rate reached 1,120 in the second quarter, and the staff is particularly proud of the momentum this newsletter is gaining.

Mr. Walker introduced Ms. Cara Welch (present via Zoom) from the Employment Development Department to discuss the California New Employer Registry Report. She shared that approval has been granted to release this information to SETA every month moving forward. The report provides an overview of the progression of new employer registration rates in California. Ms. Welch presented graphs illustrating Sacramento County's new employer registration totals from 2019 to 2023 and totals for the first three quarters of 2024, which are attached to these minutes.

B. Seminars Workgroup

Mr. Hoke provided an overview of the seminars that took place from 2021 to 2024. He also mentioned that the seminars for 2025 have been scheduled as well.

Mr. Walker informed the Committee that the annual Request for Information to solicit vendors for future workshops and seminars will be released at the end of this month. He invited interested members to join a reading group to review various seminars/workshop proposals.

C. Seminars Sponsorships in 2025

Mr. Ellis reviewed the related section of the handout.

D. Promoting Employer Services Workgroup

Mr. Walker mentioned that the SETA Public Information Officer is currently reviewing the list of services being promoted to employers. This review aims to identify which services fall under the responsibility of the Sacramento Works, Inc. Board/Employer Outreach Committee (EOC) and which are the responsibility of the Agency. Further updates on the progress will be provided before the next EOC meeting.

E. Employer Meetings/e-Newsletter

Mr. Walker shared a success story with Search Pros Staffing LLC, emphasizing SETA's valuable services, including recruitment and training of employees through the Metrix Learning system.

Mr. Ellis reviewed the presentation from EMRL, which is attached to these minutes for reference.

Additionally, Mr. Walker supplied a printed copy of the Employer Newsletter Report

F. 2025 Action Plan (Draft) and Annual Program

The 2025 Action Plan has been approved at today's meeting under Action/Discussion Item I-B. Mr. Ellis reviewed the 2025 Annual Program, which provided information about the number of EOC meetings, seminars, employer meetings, and monthly e-newsletters.

Mr. Ellis shared that Ms. Hilary Tellesen recently resigned from the Committee as she moved on from Valley Vision and will not be replaced by the organization at this time.

Mr. Ellis reviewed the current quorum requirements and policies provided in the handout.

C. Deputy Director/Program Manager

Mr. Kim informed the Committee that SETA has released the WIOA Local and Regional Strategic Development Plans, which are now available for public comment online. These plans will be presented for approval at the Sacramento Works, Inc. Board meeting in March and the Governing Board meeting in April.

He also mentioned that Congress has passed a continuing resolution that does not include WIOA funding. The new pending legislation contains significant changes compared to the current system. SETA closely monitors the situation and will provide updates as they become available.

Mr. Walker announced that several events are scheduled this year, including job fairs and recruitment events at various locations. He invited the members of the Committee to join him on employer tours that were initiated this year. Recently, he had an informative visit to the Sacramento Area Sewer District facility located in South Sacramento, where staff learned about the water cleaning process and made connections for potential recruitment partnerships.







The emails directed recipients to a landing page where 48 people filled out the interest form, and a number of people reportedly responded to William directly.


Originally scheduled to run over five weeks with one email per week, the campaign was paused after receiving an overwhelming response to the first two emails.

Seminar registration and promotion

Key highlights

- Improved attendee experience by streamlining the registration process, sending invites and reminder emails, tracking registrations, and follow up emails
- Featured events in monthly newsletters.
- Created targeted social media posts.
- In June and August, we collaborated with CEA to invite employers to seminars via email, with registrations tracked directly by CEA.
- For other events we sent emails to employers directing them to a **custom registration page** we developed:
 - July 18th: How to Access and Use SETA/SWI Services, 61 people registered
 - September 19th: How Employers Can Access Subsidized Employment Opportunities, 46 people registered
 - October 17th: Disability Awareness Webinar with Department of Rehabilitation, 143 people registered

ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEM 1-B Approval of EOC 2025 Funding Request

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve contracting with the California Employers Association (CEA), Cooperative Personnel Services Human Resources Consulting (CPSHR), and/or similar vendors for business workshops/seminars like those identified below in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.

BACKGROUND:

In February 2025, the Employer Outreach Committee approved the release of a Request for Information on Business Workshops/Seminars. SETA Sacramento Works received two information responses by the February 16th deadline.

(1) California Employers Association and (2) CPS HR Consulting.

The Employer Outreach Workshop Subcommittee short-listed the following topics and sent out a survey for Board and Committee members to rank these topics in order of the most beneficial to offer as seminars to employers:
