# CALL TO ORDER ROLL CALL

Mr. Ellis called the meeting to order at 3:03 p.m. The roll was called; guorum was established.

#### **II. INFORMATION ITEMS:**

**A.** Special Guest – Myla Ramos (SearchPros CEO)

Mr. Cobb had the honor of introducing Ms. Myla Ramos, the esteemed CEO of SearchPros. Ms. Ramos shared her personal and professional journey, highlighting the mission of SearchPros.

Ms. Malvetti arrived and was seated at 3:14 p.m.

**B.** Promoting Employer Services Workgroup

Mr. Ellis invited any members interested in joining the workgroup to come forward, but there were no volunteers at this time. Ms. Hutchinson and Ms. Hosokawa are already part of the committee. The next goal of the workgroup is to brainstorm ideas for promoting employer services, which can then be implemented by SETA's Public Information Officer (PIO). Ms. Tarianna Perez, SETA's PIO, reviewed improvements to SETA's social media and website.

#### C. Staffing Firms Workgroup

Mr. Cobb mentioned that the workgroup meetings offer an opportunity to discuss openly the crucial role that third parties, such as staffing firms, play in effectively connecting employers and employees.

Mr. Ellis reviewed the information included in the handout.

Currently, the workgroup consists of Mr. Cobb, Ms. Hutchinson, Ms. Anderson, and Mr. Ellis.

The next workgroup meeting will be scheduled soon and is expected to take place within the next couple of months.

#### **D.** KPI Monitoring Workgroup

Mr. Ellis and Mr. Walker reviewed the KPI report included in the handout. Mr. Walker noted that the group is working on adjusting some of the goal numbers, particularly for virtual recruitment and job fairs, as more people return to in-person events. Additionally, the definition of small employers will be revised to include micro-employers with five or more employees.

#### E. Seminars Workgroup

Mr. Ellis mentioned and thanked Spencer Hoke the long-time leader of this workgroup who has moved on to a new job and is not currently available to continue on the Committee. This change does not affect currently planned seminars.

## F. e-Newsletter Update & Employer Meetings

Ms. Elise Clark from EMRL provided an update on the e-newsletter and reviewed the report, which was provided as a handout and included statistics for May.

#### **G.** 2025 Action Plan & Annual Program

Mr. Ellis reviewed the 2025 Action Plan and the Annual Program included in the EOC handout.

## H. EOC Housekeeping

Mr. Ellis emphasized his desire for the Committee to expand to thirteen members, which would enable more members to participate in workgroups.

#### **B.** Executive Director:

Ms. Maldonado reported that SETA continues to monitor updates related to federal funding and their potential impacts on the Agency. It appears that the Head Start program will be funded at the same level as the previous year, while there has been an increase in funding for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) program. However, the Refugee and Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding is still proposed for elimination.

She also announced that SETA has hired a new Staff Development Officer, Ms. Zakiya Khalfani, and suggested that she would be an excellent guest to invite to one of the Committee meetings.

Additionally, Ms. Maldonado mentioned that SETA has received funding from the James Irvine Foundation. One of the initiatives funded will involve creating a Cross-Advisory Board. More information on the Board's recruitment will be coming shortly.

#### **C.** Deputy Director/Program Manager:

Mr. Kim reiterated that funding allocations for WIAO have seen increases, with Adult and Youth funding up by 16% and Dislocated Worker funding increasing by 30%.

At the last SETA Governing Board meeting, a prudent funding extension recommendation for the Job Centers and Youth providers was approved. SETA is also setting aside additional funds to address future contingencies, as the agency relies heavily on CSBG funding to help stabilize customers in crisis and connect them to long-term interventions through Job Centers and other programs. More information will be shared as it becomes available.

# ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEM 1-B Approval of Key Performance Indicator (KPI) Goals Program Year (PY) 2025-2026

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Review the KPI Workgroup report and approve the KPI Goals for PY2025-2026

#### BACKGROUND:

In October 2021, the Employer Outreach Committee (EOC) formed the KPI Workgroup to develop and recommend significant goals to be met by SETA Sacramento Works' Employer Services Unit.

In line with past practice, the current KPI Workgroup is recommending adjustments to KPI Goals consistent with current trends.
